

Remembering Loren Cocking (1937-2019) By Craig Hinde

Those who have been in the Stage Company for several years will certainly remember Loren Cocking who died December 19, 2019. Loren was instrumental to the Company for three decades until he and his wife, Lisa Colby, moved from Carbondale. He was one of the 15 founders of the S.C. in 1982 and co-authored, along with me, the Stage Company Constitution and By-laws which defined the management structure of our organization.

While serving in many capacities, Loren was best known for designing and building such beautiful sets – for at least 37 productions, even designing a couple after moving to Oregon. He also was chief carpenter for at least that many more plays, especially in the early years. His other skills included lighting design and program publishing. He served on the Council in various roles and had a stint as President in the late 1980s, and later as V.P. for Productions. And of course, he was involved in the renovation of the Varsity Theater in 2008. He was known for meticulously planning and executing any project he took on.

I became acquainted with Loren in 1967 when I joined the film production department at SIU. He, Howard Cotton and myself, along with department head, Frank Paine, made several award-winning films together over the next few years. He later joined the Dept. of Cinema and Photography and taught film production for several more years. His former students have praised him for his teaching aplomb.

Of all of Loren's theatrical work, I am sure he was most pleased with creating a musical play (book, lyrics and music) based on James Thurber's "13 CLOCKS." It was a personal project he started for fun many years earlier and would return to it from time to time. Around 2006 he really wanted to see his opus played on stage. He began negotiating with Thurber's family and eventually got permission to do one local performance. In 2008, as a Stage Company event, he produced it in McLeod Theater. In my opinion it was a very creative and excellent production, one in which Loren was justly proud.

Loren was graduated from the University of Iowa in 1960 and received a Masters from The Ohio State University in 1975. He came to SIU-Carbondale in 1962 and a short time later married Denice Josten. They have two children from that marriage, Marcie and Julie. He married Lisa in 1994. In 2012 they moved from Carbondale to Hillsboro, Oregon and then to Raleigh, North Carolina in 2016. He died unexpectedly and suddenly at home there. When he moved from Carbondale the Stage Company gave him a send-off which included a plaque commemorating especially his scene designs as his "immaculate conceptions." He is truly missed.
